The camps will run from June to December for a month to three per participant according to their availability. The target groups are students in vacation and graduates preparing for university.

AYINA Think Tank in collaboration with Carnegie Mellon University Africa (www.cmu.edu/africa) is also launching at the same time the e-learning platform for distance students mentoring and tutoring to allow those who may not attend the program physically to still benefit from it online.

- Accommodation from 300 to 600 USD
